



WV-VA Pipeline Monitoring Program Training

The WV-VA Water Quality Monitoring Program is a program developed by Trout Unlimited that is being implemented by Trout Unlimited and WV Rivers to train volunteers to monitor streams for impacts from shale gas and pipeline related development and other sources of nonpoint pollution.

Appalachian Voices has partnered with Trout Unlimited and WV Rivers to organize a training for volunteers to monitor along the proposed Mountain Valley Pipeline.

The goal of this workshop is to train volunteers to effectively monitor water quality on high priority streams along proposed pipeline routes before, during and after potential pipeline construction. The WV-VA Pipeline Monitoring Program is an objective data collection effort and does not engage in advocacy-related activities.
